



BE SURE TO CONSULT WITH YOUR ROOMMATE ON WHAT HE/SHE IS BRINGING SO THAT YOU DON'T BRING TWO OF THE SAME ITEM.

- Computer (optional)
- Touch-tone telephone (one per room)
- Refrigerator (optional – maximum size **2.9 cubic foot**, one per room)
- Curtains, if desired (see Floor Plan on next page for window and closet measurements)
- Carpet, if desired (see Floor Plan for room measurements)
- Personal toiletries and linens
- Cleaning supplies
- Lamp, if desired (no halogen)
- Poster putty (posters and pictures hang best with this)
- Decorative items (items on walls must be hung with poster putty—no nails, tacks or tape)
- Dry-Erase board and/or magnets for residence hall doors
- School supplies and books
- Television, stereo, DVD player (optional)
- Alarm clock with battery back-up
- Flashlight
- Shower shoes/flip-flops
- Iron with automatic shut-off (ironing boards provided in laundry facilities)
- Extra storage containers or shelving units
- Umbrella
- Trash can and trash bags
- Fan (highly recommended)
- Laundry detergent, laundry basket, and/or bag
- First aid supplies (thermometer, medications, bandages, etc.)
- Basic tools (flat and phillips screwdriver, pliers, etc.)
- Surge protector power strips (available in Cougar Corner Bookstore)
- Cooking supplies (mixing bowl, spatula, wooden spoon, cake pan, muffin tin). There are community kitchens on campus.
- Jumper cables and snow shovel to keep in your trunk if you have a car.

Note: Students tell us that it is best not to bring everything when you first move into the residence hall. They advise to wait until you see how much room remains after you and your roommate have arranged what you need, then plan to bring any more “stuff” when you return home for fall semester break.
